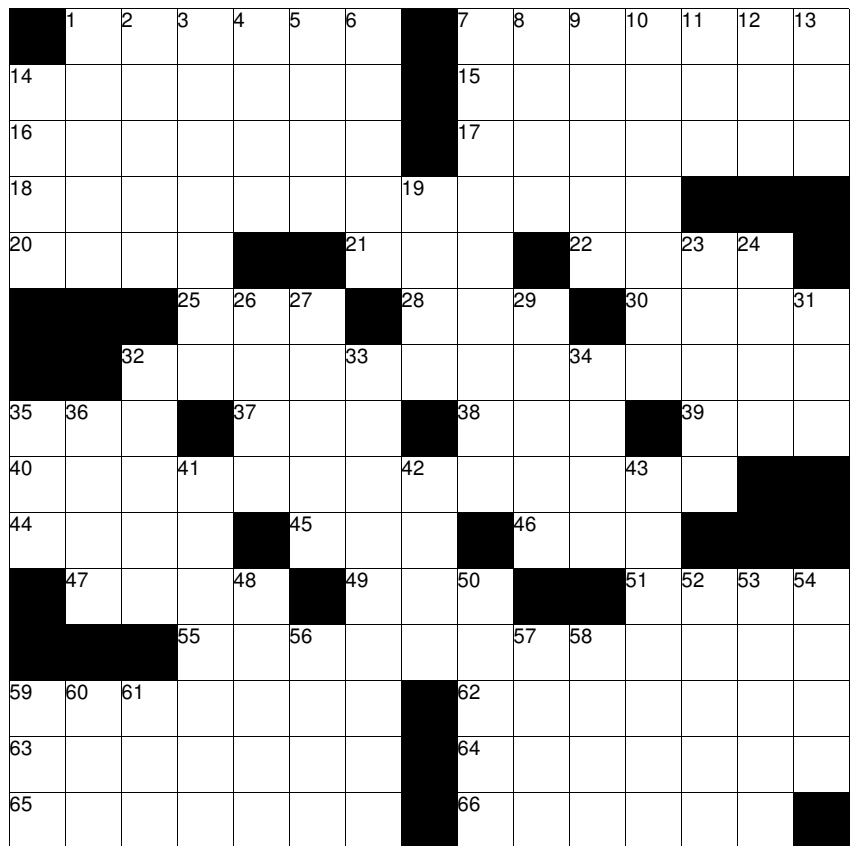


"Where Does It End?" a metapuzzle by Peter Washington
